CGD is an inherited disorder of phagocytic cells, resulting in an inability to produce bactericidal superoxide anions. This leads to recurrent life-threatening bacterial and fungal infections. Living with CGD has a big impact on quality of life and living with this chronic condition can be extremely stressful not only for the individual but for the families involved. The CGD Research Trust's mission is to fund research into the treatment and management of CGD and to provide valuable support and information for the affected community.

Following consultation with our membership the Trust identified a real and urgent need for a CGD specific psychologist service to deal with feelings of anger, depression, frustration, unhappiness, and isolation. The Clinical Psychology Department at Salisbury is being funded by the CGD Research Trust to provide a service to its members. This service aims to help individuals who have the condition *and also* their families. It is not meant to replace provision within the NHS but aims to extend the provision available. Dr North will be establishing the service in the South of England, and subsequently 'rolling it out' in two other centres, one in the Midlands and the third in the North. For the purposes of the service, the 'South' includes South Wales and in England, Oxfordshire, Gloucestershire and everything south of those counties. Please contact Rosemarie Rymer at our head office to check if the current service provision falls within this region.

This service will form part of a co-ordinated service for people affected by CGD comprising of a paediatric CGD specialist nurse based at Great Ormond Street Hospital and an adult nursing service at Wythenshawe Hospital in Manchester (from October 2007), all funded by The CGD Research Trust.

The Clinical Psychology Service at Salisbury District Hospital has existed for approximately 30 years. The department provides a service for people undergoing treatment at the hospital for a wide variety of medical and chronic conditions, injuries sustained in accidents and undergoing surgical procedures.

The department is well respected in the field of clinical psychology as applied to physical health and illness and has developed a wealth of experience and expertise in helping people and their families to cope with illness, injury and surgery.

The Service

A Clinical Psychology service will be offered to members of the CGD Research Trust and their families. We are happy to receive referrals from you. These would be for people who are experiencing a range of psychosocial or emotional difficulties.

Such difficulties may include:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Body Image problems
- Relationship issues
- Adjustment problems
- Anger Control
- Cognitive Difficulties

This list is not exhaustive and there may be other problems with which individuals need help.

Referrals

We are very keen to work with you in helping people with psychosocial issues and to receive referrals from you. We offer an advice service so that we can be contacted by phone, fax or letter to offer help and advice about any issues you think may be relevant.

We also offer a self-referral service so that individuals and/or their families can contact us directly to arrange appointments or obtain help and advice from our service.

We would at all times keep you informed about people referred to our service and in this way we would hope to promote a truly holistic approach for people.

Who will be involved?

The project will be headed by the **Dr Nigel North**, at Salisbury District Hospital who has worked in the field of Clinical Psychology applied to a healthcare setting for over twenty years. He has a special interest in chronic conditions and cognitive problems and is widely published in the areas of oncology, stroke, head injury, spinal cord injury, post-traumatic stress disorder and neuropsychology.

There are a number of other qualified Clinical Psychologists in the department and these include:

Dr Sophie Tegg who has a special interest in burns, plastic surgery, pain management and rehabilitation.

Dr Hannah Falvey who has a special interest in plastic surgery, trauma and post-traumatic stress disorder.

Dr Kate Jenkins who has a special interest in oncology, palliative care, bereavement and post traumatic stress disorder.
